
## 50 Yr. Reunion – Class of '59



## Mary (Soukup) Ringling -1990 - 20 Yrs



## Alumni News

#### FROM THE DESK OF SUPERINTENDENT SUSAN L. SMIT



Our school year is off to a terrific start! About fifty new students have joined our educational family. Twelve new staff members have joined our ranks. New programs have been added. It is exciting! JAG (Jobs for America's Graduates) is a program directed at preparing students for their futures. At the high school level JAG has been combined with the

Alternative Education Program. At the middle school level JAG is a stand alone program. JAG students participate in a career focused curriculum while at the same time planning and carrying out a community service project. A club component is another critical piece of the experience. About twenty four students in grades seven through nine are involved. Six Wagner staff members participated in training in Atlanta this past summer in preparation for getting the program off the ground.

In the spring of 2009 the school district withdrew from the Zenith Alternative Education Program offered by the South Central Cooperative. The decision was made to operate an alternative school inside the walls of Wagner Community School. Nearly all of the students receiving services at Zenith were also taking classes at Wagner High School. A lot of time was being lost between the two buildings. The infusion of computers into education has significantly changed how education can take place. Currently fiftyeight students are taking between one and four course(s) in the alternative setting. Some students are taking online AP classes while others are taking online dual credit college classes. Still others are working on credit recovery through a computer based program called APEX. Students come and go from the suite of rooms as they individually meet their educational needs. Two certified teachers provide educational support. Initial reports indicate the move to look at alternative education as more than credit recovery has been good for kids!

Johnson Controls has been working on an energy efficiency project targeting stabilization of heating and cooling within the building. The project is scheduled for completion within the next few months. The majority of the work was completed during the summer months. The

school board is in the process of making final plans for a kitchen/dining room project to be completed the fall of 2010. The addition will be located on the east side of the building on the grassy area to the north of the gym addition. Also being

the addition of an elementary principal's office to the east side of the building. Recommendations include adding a canopy to the west side of the building and moving the high school principal's office to existing classrooms presently being occupied by the Alternative Education Program. Alternative classrooms would be reconfigured into the area presently occupied by the principals. Doors could be locked at 8:30 a.m. and all students and visitors would be required to enter through the principal's offices before gaining access to the rest of the building.

Also being recommended is renovation of the bathrooms on the backside of the theater to make them handicap accessible and bring us into compliance with fire codes when we have large events in our gym. Finally, the space currently occupied by the food service kitchen would be available for receiving of equipment/merchandise and general storage. Final decisions will be made in the very near future! The Wagner Red Raiders are doing well in fall activities. I encourage you to keep an eye out for more state champions, whether it is in sports or music or oral interpretation. Co-curricular activities support educational experiences. They help students prepare to become well rounded, contributing members of a democratic society. We are about education, but we are also about real life and 21<sup>st</sup> century skills. Learning to work together to achieve a goal is what real life is all about! We have a terrific facility! We have a strong school board invested in providing a quality education to each and every student. We have professional teachers dedicated to student growth. We have a wonderful support staff and they make sure students are provided with a safe and healthy learning environment. We are a team and we are committed to working side by side with parents in meeting the individual needs of their child. In June 2009, Wagner Community Memorial Hospital-Avera completed a new medical clinic and physical therapy addition. Since then, renovations have been completed to relocate and update the laboratory and radiology departments. Current objectives include the most expansive plans which WCMH-A has undertaken since 1974, if not ever. In the summer of 2010 WCMH-A has aspiration of embarking on the construction of a new inpatient wing along with the complete renovation of the current hospital patient wings for expanding outpatient services. The addition will encompass 15-17 technology advanced patient rooms with emphasis on enhanced and advanced healthcare delivery while addressing patient and family convenience and comfort.
